

UDRC 2015 Accomplishments

Project Wildfire:

During May, Alison Green, through Project Wildfire, coordinated free ladder fuel drop offs at county transfer sites. UDRC volunteers assisted in the disposal of over 2000 cubic yards of ladder fuel at the South County transfer station. Besides coordinating incoming traffic flow for vehicles and loaded trailers, volunteers distributed Project Wildfire and UDRC literature to all drivers arriving at the site during the May Fire Free Weekend.

Other county funds were used to treat ladder fuel removal on three acres of River Meadows HOA lands. Ray Cecchi and ten River Meadows volunteers helped thin out HOA lands this summer.

Allison is encouraging other board members to contact her now for tentative ladder fuel reduction projects prior to the 2016 fire season. This includes local resident volunteer project hours using project wildfire funding for chipping and ladder fuel removal on private lands. UDRC/USFS – WUI Fuel Reduction Projects:

In late 2014, John Allen and Carl Jansen signed a participating agreement allowing the Forest Service, the UDRC, and local community volunteers to treat more than 3000 acres on both private and public lands at selected locations within our Wildland-Urban Interface of 69,000 acres. The Forest Service will contribute \$5,000 per year, matched by funds and volunteer time from the UDRC community residents. The Forest Service will treat their adjacent lands with direct funding.

The Deschutes National Forest released \$5,000 per year to support neighborhood ladder fuel reduction projects. Maybelle Clark McDonald Foundation announced a \$25,000 grant over a five year period to support ladder fuel reduction projects on private lands. Jerry Hubbard was responsible for the funding application and will

River Meadows Ray Checci continue to coordinate the management of the grant funds together by reporting to our board, the Forest Service and Maybelle Clark McDonald Foundation management.

Forest Service Junction Vegetation Management Project:

Another major project approved by the Forest Service in 2015 is the 17,000 acre Junction Project. This project is located on Forest Service lands, near FS40, FS42, and FS45 roads. These roads are primary access roads for local residents and tourists entering the Deschutes National Forest recreation areas. Treatments include: overstory tree removal, seed tree harvesting, commercial thinning, prescribed burning, and mowing with a focus on ladder fuel reduction.

Greater La Pine Basin Cohesive Strategy Project:

Dean Richardson, Jim Larson and Carl Jansen participated in a series of summer discussions with many partners and other landowners to outline a proposed plan to treat over 340,000 acres of private and public lands, ranging from Spring River in Deschutes County to Chemult in Klamath County.

John Allan and his Forest Service staff, together with other key associates in the Walker Ranger District, presented the final proposal to a group in La Pine in October. Many associates, including the UDRC, support this \$2 million plus request which has been submitted to USFS Region 6 in Portland. Pending approval in Portland, the proposal will be reviewed and hopefully approved by the USFS headquarters in Washington D.C.

No Shooting Zone Established Near Lloyd Way:

Through the dedicated efforts of Bill Moore and local DRRH 1-5 residents, the Forest Service moved boulders and posted "No Shooting" signs around the Forest Service owned cinder pit near Lloyd Way. Problems like stray shots going into homes, and noise at night have disturbed many of our local residents.

September SOLVE/UDRC Riverside Cleanup:

Over 75 resident volunteers from Bend, UDRC and La Pine participated in removing over 500 pounds of human caused trash residing on 40 miles along four river banks located from Wickiup to Lava Lands. Besides the Upper Deschutes, river banks on the Little Deschutes, and the Fall and Spring Rivers were cleaned of

Community groups from the Ya Ya Sisterhood, Sunriver Nature Center, and Bend area residents helped on this project. During the past eight years, managed by the UDRC and SOLVE, over three tons of trash, including a sunken pontoon boat, abandoned wall safes, and car batteries have been removed.

Kody Osborn, Lead Naturalist at the SR Nature Center, has agreed to coordinate all future SOLVE September cleanups. He will contact future volunteers directly. The Sunriver Nature Center has been involved in Arbor Day events in the spring. Our partner will now coordinate the river clean up event, allowing the planning team to focus on more critical events and services.

Upper Deschutes River Basin Study:

The Upper Deschutes Basin Study is underway, and technical teams are working on their contracted tasks. Jeff Wieland, UDRC board member and study team member, has been engaged for several years and continues to update us on progress. Bureau of Reclamation requires that basin studies include a community outreach plan to keep the public informed of progress.

UDRC spent \$1,100 with our website developer, Pro Q Solutions, to upgrade the site's integrity.
